

Make an Egyptian Collar

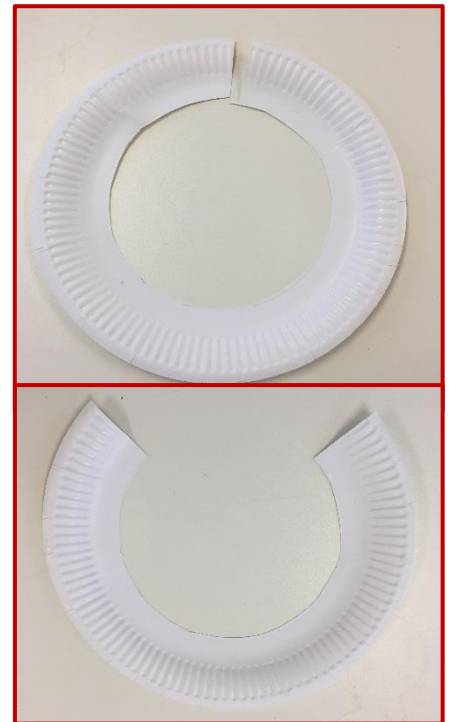


You will need:

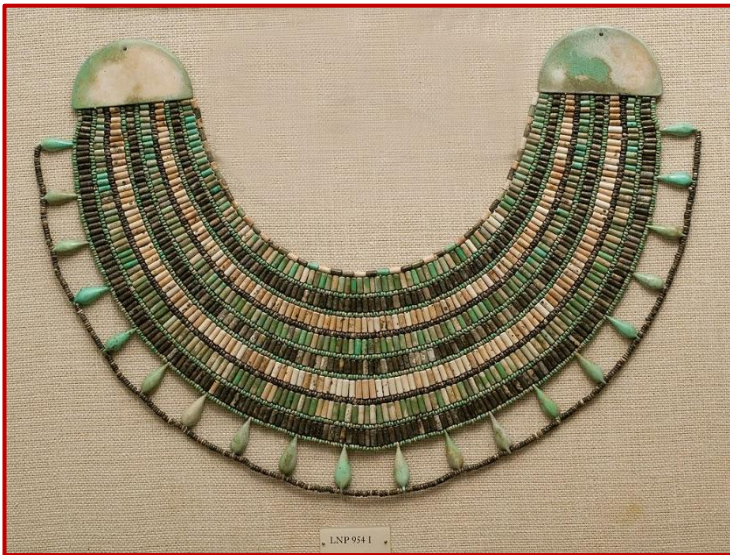
- Paper plate
- Felt tips/colouring pencils
- Glitter/stickers
- Wool/ elastic/ string
- Hole punch
- Scissors

Instructions:

- Use scissors to cut the inner circle of the paper plate out.
- Cut the end of the plate to make an opening large enough to go around your neck.
- Decorate your collar using felt tips, glitter and stickers. Make sure you decorate the non-shiny, rough side of the plate.
- Use a hole punch to make a hole at either end of the collar. Tie a short length of elastic/string or wool into each of the holes.
- Try your collar on and tie the strings in a bow at the back of your neck.



The Ancient Egyptians wore lots of different types of jewellery. Collar necklaces were a favourite of wealthy Egyptian men and women. They were made from brightly coloured stone beads and precious metals, such as gold.
