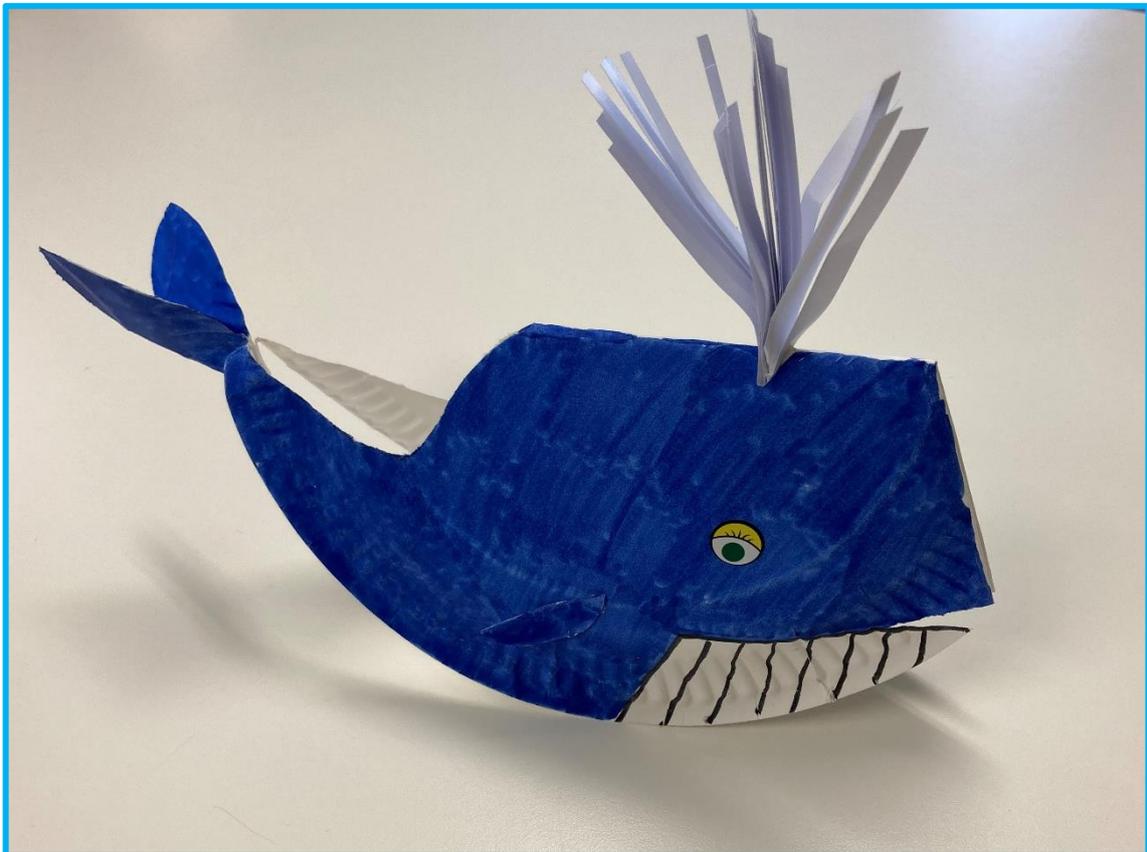

Wade the Whale Paper Plate



You will need:

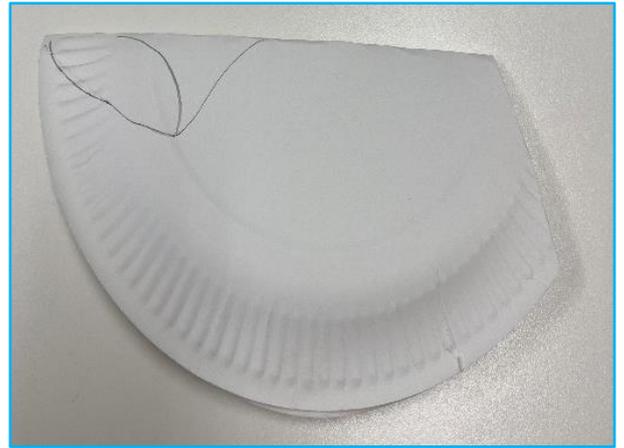
- Paper plate
- Felt tips/ colouring pencils
- Glue
- Scissors
- White paper

Method:

- Fold the paper plate in half.
- Fold over the right corner of the plate that is next to the centre fold.
- Open the plate up a little to push both sides of this corner fold inwards.



- Draw the shape from the photo onto the left corner of the plate against the centre fold.
- Keep the plate folded as you cut out the right-hand side of the shape you have drawn on.
- Open the plate back up and bend out the flap you have created to make the tail.
- Glue the middle of the tail together to help it keep its shape.



- Glue together the inside folded edges of the whale's face to help the whale stand up.
- Use felt tips or colouring pencils to colour in the whale and draw on a beady eye!
- On the part of the plate you cut away earlier, draw and cut out a pair of semi-circles for the fins.
- Colour these in and stick them on either side of the whale.



- Cut out a small triangle for the whale's mouth—the photo shows where this should be in yellow.



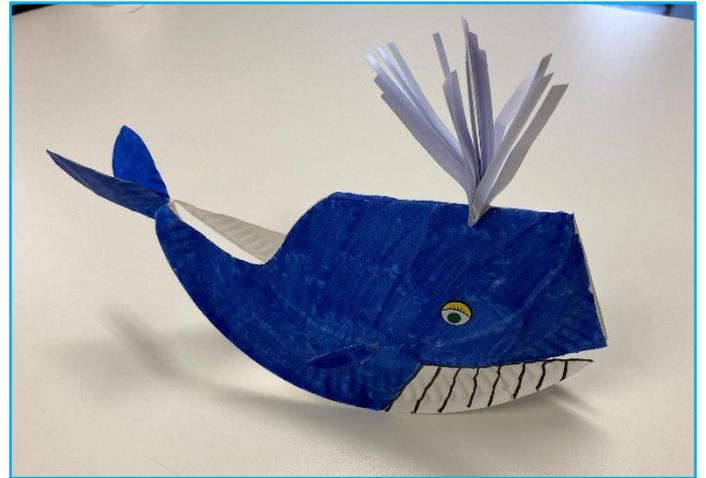
- Cut out a rectangle of white paper (approx. 20cm x 10cm) and cut strips along its length, leaving a 2cm band at the top.



- Cut out a small triangle on top of the whale's head.
- Roll the end of the paper together and insert this into the triangle cut on the whale's head.



- Fan out the paper strands and your whale is finished!
